



Expanded Outdoor Seating & Pedestrianization

During Phase 1 of New Orleans "reopening," restaurants are allowed a maximum of 25% capacity, a threshold that cannot sustain most businesses given staffing and operational costs. To create opportunities for these struggling businesses, the Administration and City Council are considering measures taken in other cities, including [Tampa](#), [Atlanta](#), and [Cincinnati](#), to expand dining capacity outside. Facing logistical challenges, some cities, like [New York](#), have dialed back their efforts.

On Wednesday, Mayor LaToya Cantrell discussed creating opportunities for supporting the French Quarter during a [town hall meeting](#). "I call it, ["No cars in the Quarter,"](#) Cantrell said of her idea. "This is the city's time to reimagine just how we live, how we move about, how we enjoy, and how we get to know and learn the fabric of our city."

It was unclear if she was referring to limiting some vehicular traffic while allowing for basic services and access to residential homes or if she is envisioning a complete prohibition of vehicles in the neighborhood. It has certainly sparked a lot of [conversation](#).

As these ideas are only in an exploratory phase, it is crucial that all French Quarter stakeholders are engaged in this process, every step of the way. VCPORA is currently in discussions with the Mayor's Administration and District C Councilmember to explore creative opportunities to engage locals with the heart of our City. Our residents value the neighborhood-serving businesses that contribute to the authenticity of this mixed-use neighborhood. We look forward to working with the City to ensure that such reopening measures balance the needs of residents, businesses, and emergency services.

Evacuteers Needed

New Orleans residents are encouraged to become [NOLA Ready Evacuation Volunteers](#) during the 2020 hurricane season, which starts June 1. The first volunteer training will be held online at 6:00 p.m. next Thursday, June 4. An estimated 35,000 New Orleanians are unable to evacuate on their own ahead of a major storm. City-Assisted Evacuation, run by NOHSEP and the New Orleans Fire Department, provides transportation assistance as an option of last resort for these residents during a mandatory evacuation order.

Due to the unique nature of this hurricane season occurring simultaneously with the COVID-19 pandemic, organizing volunteers in 2020 will involve key medical and health considerations best informed by the strategic leadership of NOHSEP

and NOMRC. NOLA Ready Evacuation Volunteers will be trained online, will undergo a background check, and will also be called upon for other public safety volunteer opportunities year-round. Due to COVID-19, all staff, volunteers, and evacuees will be provided with Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and will be required to socially distance if a mandatory evacuation is necessary.
