5G Pole Demonstration

This week, two demonstrations of the Toro-Blanco, LLC prototype for a 5G cell tower were held in the neighborhood. VCPORA, along with the Vieux Carré Commission Foundation, French Quarter Management District, French Quarter Business Association, the Mayor's Office of Utilities, and the Vieux Carré Commission have been working with cellular wireless carriers and pole manufacturers to directly address the issues surrounding 5G deployment in the French Quarter.

The most recent federal ruling, [City of Portland v. United States](#), upheld the authority of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) that prevents local municipalities from an outright prohibition of 5G installation. However, cities can regulate their design and locations, and the infrastructure does need to go through a [Section 106 process](#) if it has the potential to affect historic resources.



POLE SIZE COMPARISONS



The original designs for 5G poles (shown above) were of 35' to 40' towers with bulky, cabinet attachments. After months of collaboration, Toro Blanco, LLC has provided us with a prototype for a considerably shorter, lamppost modeled after our existing streetlights.

This design is not final and is very much subject to modification. The proposed locations are still being reviewed and we hope to share an updated map very soon. New Orleans Moves into Phase 3.2

The City of New Orleans announced this week that it will be moving into [Phase 3, priority 2](#), effective tomorrow, October 17. Please remember that masks are required in public, social distancing is encouraged, and all businesses must follow the City and State guidelines for safe operations.

Indoor live entertainment will be allowed in restaurants, indoor event venues, and concert halls. Singing, karaoke, and wind-blown instruments are prohibited indoors. Bars and breweries will be allowed to have outdoor seating of 25% permitted occupancy or 50 individuals, whichever is fewer. Alcohol sales are limited to the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m.

Houses of worship, movie theaters, conference venues, outdoor stadiums, and large venues will be allowed to open for timed, seated events at 50% of permitted occupancy or 500 individuals, whichever is fewer. Concert halls will be allowed to open for timed, seated events at 50% of permitted occupancy or 250 individuals, whichever is fewer. Louisiana early voting began today. Voters can participate at [select locations](#) through October 27 (excluding Sundays) from 8:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. [Click here](#) to view your sample ballot and be sure to vote safely by masking up, social distancing in line, and washing or sanitizing your hands after using the voting machine. Remember that October 30 is the deadline to [request an absentee ballot](#) for the November 3 election.

In addition, Roll to the Polls and Ride New Orleans will be out at transit hubs like Duncan Plaza to pass out RTA 1 Day Jazzy Passes to transit riders who need help getting to the polls during early voting.
