

Hurricane Delta

Orleans Parish is under a [Tropical Storm warning](#) as Hurricane Delta makes landfall across southwest Louisiana today. New Orleans residents and visitors should be prepared to stay indoors, as strong winds and tornadoes are possible as a result of Delta's bands. Text DELTA to 888-777 to receive severe weather updates from the City.

Delta is expected to severely impact the Lake Charles area, which is still recovering from the impact of Hurricane Laura just over one month ago. Over the next few days, please consider donating time or money to the rebuilding efforts. Councilmember Moreno has also put together a list of [resources, places to donate, and volunteer opportunities](#) for those interested in helping relief efforts.



Nungesser's Proposal

On Wednesday, Lieutenant Governor Billy Nungesser announced during a [KPEL Radio interview](#) a potential proposal that would allow the State to take over some control of the French Quarter, including sanitation and security services. His remarks sound very similar to [previous ideas to turn the Vieux Carré into a State Park](#), which was rejected by Mayor Cantrell in 2018.

"For the past few years New Orleans has been trending down," Nungesser said. "Now, with the shutdown, we believe that if we don't clean up the Quarter and bring it back with a bang, it will have a negative impact on tourism as we open up the doors nationally and internationally. So goes New Orleans, so goes tourism around the state... We're working on a plan to present to [Mayor Latoya Cantrell] to do what they did in San Diego where they took the Gaslamp District away from the city, had their own police force, cleaned the street and really make it the shining star it ought to be."

Clarifying details of what this shift would look like have not been revealed yet. We have many questions about the implications this maneuver could have on economic recovery in the area. Particularly, what impacts would this have on the upcoming French Quarter Economic Development District "Quarter for the Quarter" tax and the Mayor's plans to Reimagine the French Quarter? We will be certain to share information as we receive it and welcome your comments.



Bill Norris, 1933 – 2020

It is with heavy hearts that we share news of the [recent passing](#) of William C. "Bill" Norris. He and his surviving wife Betty moved to the French Quarter in 1990, where they live and worked with bodies like VCPORA, the Vieux Carré Commission, and Patio Planters of the Vieux Carré to preserve the neighborhood's historic fabric for nearly 30 years. And avid tour guide, Bill even taught tour guiding at Delgado Community College and published a book of local history titled '[Down in New Orleans: True Stories of a Fabled City](#)'.
