

Big preparations are underway for our 2022 Annual Gala, “**A Fête for All Saints**” on **November 12, 2022** at the **Carmelite Monastery**.


Don't miss your chance to become a patron or sponsor for the big event and have your name listed in the invitation and on our continued promotions. The deadline for listing your name is September 16.

Decadence Parade

Sunday, September 4, 2:00 p.m.

After a two-year hiatus, Southern Decadence returns to celebrate its 50th anniversary in the French Quarter. Festivities are planned all weekend but the official Southern Decadence Parade will roll on Sunday, September 4th, **beginning at the Golden Lantern, 1239 Royal Street.**

Grand Marshals Rikki Redd and Danny Girl will lead the festival's walking parade, themed "**Jazz Burlesque and Decadence New Orleans.**"

The parade will proceed down Royal Street, turn right on Dumaine Street, turn left on Dauphine Street, make a quick loop on St. Louis Street at N. Rampart before turning right on Burgundy Street. Then, it heads to Orleans Street, turns back on N. Rampart Street and

loops around at St. Phillip Street before ending at The Bourbon Pub and Oz at St. Ann and Bourbon Streets.



Louisiana Landmarks Society: New Orleans 9 Most Endangered

Since 2007, the [Louisiana Landmarks Society](#) has unveiled their curated selection of “New Orleans’ Nine Most Endangered Sites” from among hundreds of public submissions. Their annual listing has helped draw attention to landmark buildings in disrepair as well as trends affecting homes and neighborhoods citywide.

On August 30, a press conference was held at the historic [Pitot House](#) to release the names of 2022’s most endangered list. This year features building types, specific sites in danger, the slowly vanishing New Orleans iconic street details, and the decline of enforcement at the City level. Alert - Theft of Historic Elements Rising

This week, we heard of several instances of theft of copper elements around the neighborhood. Several lanterns have been removed and residents have witnessed people attempting, some successfully, to remove copper downspouts illegally. We have heard from the Vieux Carre Commission that these thefts are on the rise and want you to be aware. Many of you have exterior security cameras.
